

Neil Constable Biography



Neil Constable was appointed Chief Executive of Shakespeare's Globe in October, 2010. Welcoming over 1 million visitors, Shakespeare's Globe is a unique international enterprise and educational charity dedicated to the exploration and understanding of Shakespeare through education and performance. In 2012, Shakespeare's Globe was recognised as London Theatre of the Year. In 2015 Neil was named as the joint 7th and then in 2017, named as the joint 10th most influential people working in theatre and the performing arts in The Stage's Top 100.

Neil trained in Stage Management & Technical Theatre at Guildhall School of Music & Drama and has worked extensively in the theatre and arts industry for over 35-years, latterly running cultural organisations. He worked for the Royal

Shakespeare Company for 16-years, holding senior management positions of London Manager at the Barbican Centre and RSC General Administrator. Prior to the Globe he was Executive Director and joint Chief Executive of the Almeida Theatre (2003 to 2010) working with Michael Attenborough, the Artistic Director.

He is a Governor, Trustee or Member of a number of other organisations, including the Chartered Management Institute, Guildhall School Trust, Clifton College, Society of London Theatre, the Shakespeare Birthplace Trust and the Royal Theatrical Support Trust. Neil has always held a close relationship with the City from his days studying at the Guildhall School, having lived at the Barbican for the last twenty years and being a Freeman of the City of London
